Hamer-Banna of Ethiopia

The people: The Hamer-Banna are actually two ethnic groups that speak the same language, which they call Hamer-Banna, though they refer to themselves as either Hamer or Banna.

They are primarily cattle breeders, so cattle is their most treasured possession. They traditionally have cattle-raiding wars with those in Mali, Bodi and Mursi. They may also have sheep, goats and camels. The area where the Hamer-Banna people live is one of the most inaccessible and least developed part of East Africa.

Several related families live in tents arranged in a circle. The tents are made of flexible poles which are covered with thatch in the dry season and canvas mats in the rainy season. The women and young children sleep in beds, while the men and older boys often sleep on cots or stools in the center of the camp near the cattle which are brought there each night. The Hamer-Banna are nomads, but they plant sorghum and maize at the beginning of the rainy season before they leave for their journey. Some also plant sesame and beans. The crops are left unattended, so often have low yields.

The men engage in elaborate hair-dressing; they wear a clay "cap" that is painted and decorate with feathers and other ornaments. A well-dressed man will wear a toga-like cloth and carry a spear. Women often wear colorful toga-like clothing.

Men may marry as many women as they like, within their own tribe. Marriage celebrations include feasting and dancing. Men choose women who can endure a severe whipping. Women who can't endure the whipping, may never marry and their families will be disgraced. Young girls and boys are circumcised.

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Religious Beliefs

Some Hamer-Banna are Sunni Muslim and observe the five pillars of Islam. However, they blend into their Islam many elements of their traditional ethnic religion. Most Hamer-Banna practice animism, believing that physical objects such as rocks and trees have spirits. They also believe in jinns. spirits that are capable of taking on human or animal form and have supernatural influence over people. Prayer is the key to reaching them with the gospel.
